Ayakoromo/ Burutu	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Assistance for Sand bagging and sand filling of some erosion prone areas in the community; ▪ Provision of fishing nets, boats and hand paddling canoes and other materials for fishing; ▪ Support with improved farm seedlings/planting of early maturing crops before flooding; ▪ They also need herbicide (chemical) for killing weeds in their farms; ▪ Support with improved cassava stems, improved farm seedlings and other drought tolerant crops; ▪ Assistants with cassava processing machine to avoid trekking to other far communities to process cassava; ▪ Establishing community climate adaptation committee; ▪ Construction of wooden bridges /raised platforms; ▪ Construction of gutters and flood reception pits.
Igbudu/ Warri South	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Support for remover of silt from the blocked drainage. This can be in form of finance to hire able bodied men in silting the gutters; ▪ They also need help in filling or sand bagging of the affected areas; ▪ Provide assistance to setup poultry farming; ▪ Support for provision of fishes, nets and other materials for fish farming; ▪ Establishing community climate adaptation committee; ▪ Construction of wooden bridges /raised platforms; ▪ Construction of gutters and flood reception pits.
